this year and our corn looks
right well now every thing
is very high hear corn is
one doler a bushel and wheat
is two doleres a bushel and
meat is 25 to 30 cents a pound
copy is 95 cents a pound butter
is 25 cents a pound there is
a prospect for good crops
hear I saw simon Pinkley
The other day on his way to

also we are a looking for him
back every day he is a going
to set his place if he can and
buy land hear simon sai
d the pepel in greenbrier
was well when he left there
there is a heap of pepel leav
ing greenbrier very fast
