lines I have just comd off of guard and
I am som what nervous I dont know whether
I can wright a letter that you can read or not
but I will do the best I can I got a letter
from you som time ago which I was glad
to receive but was sorry to hear that you
was not well I trust that thoes few lines
may find you and your family well and all
the friends well Laben I got to the city
of Louisville a perfidat access hole I believe
that about two thirds of the citizens of this
place ar rebels it would been a god blessing
if Kentucky would of went ~~it~~ out of the union
when the rest of the states did she would
of been more loyal to day than what she
is it is a hard matter to give up the
negro but it has got to be did the negro
has got to have his freedom after the thing
has gon this far well I dont know that I know
any thing new to wright I heard this morning
that E. S. Quinn was mustered out of the service
and had you know it looks like som men
are lucky I think the regt will gid out before
long as soon as every body els get home any
how I would like to see at home very well

but I am doing very well I am getting my
good grub we live as well now as we would
if we was at home we git our Coffa Biskets
potatoes beans pickles butter with a big chunk
of ice on it and ice watter to drink want
that nice com over and take supper with
me dam sauning and lets us have a small school
I want a casing wheather school keeps as not
so the big girls come you said that you was
a going back to the mountains after harvest
I would like to git home before you leave
I think probably I will if dont I think I
will go and see you if I can find you
up thair among the rocks and hills I dont
believe that if it was my case that I would go
back untill times got mos settled
well Saban I dont know that I have any thing
mos to write I will close by requesting
you to write soon so good by for this time
you can tell the folks on the hill that
I am well and still in the army
